
Public Perception Of Knife Crime Affecting Community Cohesion In London

The topic of public perception of knife crime affecting community cohesion in London is such an important subject that we need to focus on. The issue of knife crimes are severe and widespread in London, and these crimes are usually done by young adults or even teenagers. Most youths and teenagers that perform crimes like these are usually on drugs like marijuana, cocaine, kodin, etc. These drugs affect their way of thinking and they make them react violently. Among the ending questions, he/she was questioned on how to solve the problem and give a solution.

The interviewee was further questioned on whether he/she has been involved in knife crime as a witness and how it happened, and then was asked the same question but as a victim and how it happened, and he/she was also questioned on whether he ever felt the need to carry a knife. The last question was number 22, and it asked if he/she has ever experienced a loss or if someone close to him/her has ever experienced a lot as a result of knife crime?

The public needs to understand the effect of knife crimes on communities in London. It is an issue that needs to be solved immediately, and it is not only the government that needs to solve

it but also citizens have to try hard to do away with it, we all need to work together to solve this problem and all problems.
